
What is the haemophilia foundation anyway?

Committee members for HFACT!

We need to have a functioning committee to enable us to advocate, put on functions and activities for members, employ a counsellor, and provide practical and emotional support to our members. Specifically, the Secretary position has not been filled for the past two years. We had a volunteer minute taker during 2023 which was a great help but have been without that assistance during 2024. This means the remaining three members of the Executive have had to take on additional duties.

We also need to find someone to train up into the Treasurer role. Jenny has announced her intention to step down at the AGM next year (2025). No Treasurer means no association as we cannot meet our legal obligations as an incorporated association or as a recipient of government grants. Much has been done to streamline the job of the Treasurer over the past ten years:

- we use MYOB software to manage our funds
- all banking activity is online
- reporting to the ATO is facilitated by the software
- wages and entitlements are calculated by MYOB
- regular payments are automated (Telstra, MYOB)
- audit preparation is well documented

We aim to hold these fundraising BBQs annually, so keep an eye out for notice of our next one in 2025. We look forward to more enthusiastic volunteers signing up!




Haemophilia inheritance video

If you were born male and have haemophilia, will your children have haemophilia too?

This is a burning question for a lot of young men with haemophilia but the answer and explanation of why this occurs can be difficult to grasp.

HFA has developed a 2-minute video for teenage males with haemophilia who have questions about how haemophilia is passed on in a family. It covers:

- inheritance patterns for males with haemophilia
- a short and simple explanation of the genetics involved.
